has special needs. Nicholas Penna, Jr., owner and lead stylist at SalonCapri in Newton and Dedham, MA, has the 411 on how to keep your locks looking their best.

- · Pick up a moisture rich shampoo and conditioner for the winter months, preferably one with vitamins and oils. Nick recommends L'Oréal Professionnel's Serie Expert Liss Ultime shampoo and conditioner.
- · Use Argan oil, which contains fatty acids, Vitamin E and antioxidants that restore your hair's natural luster without a greasy shine. "Use about a dime sized amount and comb it evenly through damp hair."
- · When blow-drying, always use a thermal spray or serum to protect hair. Also, be sure to go all the way. "Blow-drying hair halfway will only create frizz and damage. Spending the extra 5 minutes blow-drying hair to a smooth finish makes all the difference."
- . "Never go outside with wet hair," warns Penna. Wet or even damp hair can easily freeze once temperatures drop into the 30s, and frozen strands mean split ends.

- · "The best updos mix-up different textures," says John Bertorelli, the Team's North American Artistic Director. "First, pull one side back, twist it and secure it up. Then use flat irons and curling irons to add straight and curly texture throughout, pinning up pieces as you like."
- · For a polished, high-glam effect, sweep all your hair to one side, then redefine the ends by bumping them under with a large-barrel curling iron.
