SIMPLE STYLE SOLUTIONS

Everyone gets bored with the same old hairstyle now and then, but it can be hard to take the plunge and do something drastic. The good news: Sometimes, just a small twist is all you need to add interest to a less-than-exciting style. Nicholas Penna, Jr., owner and lead stylist at Salon Capri in Hyde Park and Newton Highlands, MA, offers these tips.

- "Incorporate subtle details into your normal style to add intrigue," says Penna, Jr. Try small braids or twists for extra flair.
- Just a few simple waves can bring new life to your look. "By giving your tresses a relaxed curl that appears effortless, you can create a bohemian-chic look," says the stylist.
- Accessories like clips and headbands are an easy way to spice up a look. The stylist tells us that while bows are very in, you should only pair them with appropriate styles. "Don't slick your hair off your forehead—bows look better paired with soft waves, angled bangs and 'roughed-up' bohemian hair," he says.

As for color, the stylist notes that celebrities are combining warmer tones on highlights and cooler tones on lowlights, creating rich, dimensional shades. It's important to remember that with the change of seasons comes a change of wardrobe, and your hair should reflect that fact. "Nothing says carefree better than healthy, shiny hair. So whether it's a new cut or a new color, it's the perfect way to welcome a brand new season."

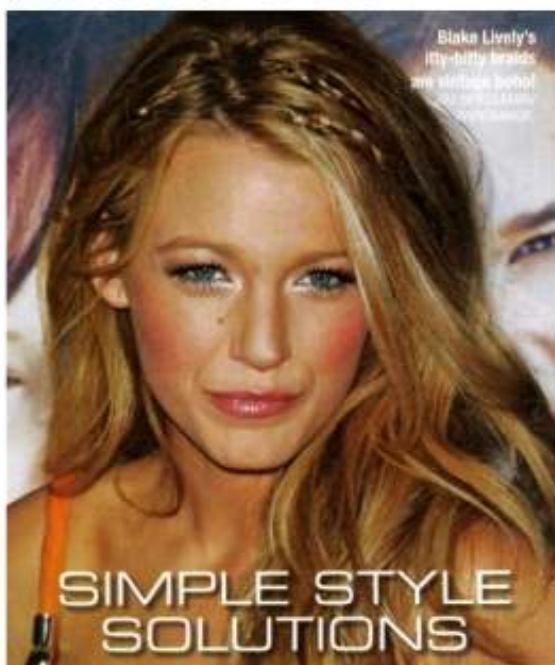
