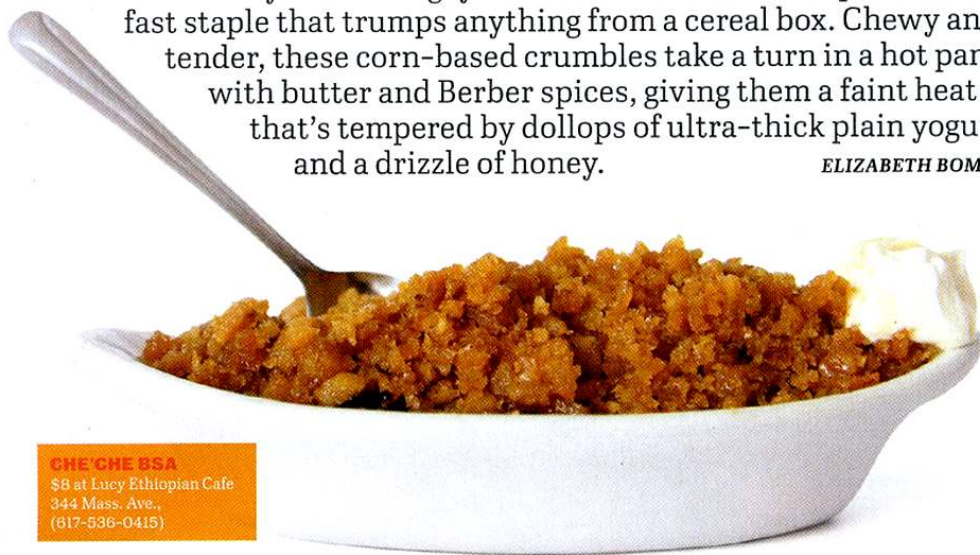

Although Lucy Ethiopian Cafe's injera might be the best version of flatbread around (it's spongy, faintly sour and delicious), it's not even the most impressive dough-based item on the menu. Chef/owner Girmay Cirsto Ziegaye's che'che bsa is an Ethiopian breakfast staple that trumps anything from a cereal box. Chewy and tender, these corn-based crumbles take a turn in a hot pan with butter and Berber spices, giving them a faint heat that's tempered by dollops of ultra-thick plain yogurt and a drizzle of honey.
