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Texture TALKS!

Texture adds character to your short cut and reveals a lot about your personality. Nicholas Penna, Jr., lead stylist and owner of SalonCapri in Newton, MA, gives us the 411 on the top texture effects and the image they convey.

THIS POPULAR ELEMENT OF STYLE SAYS A LOT ABOUT YOU.



You want to look: CUTE

Try: KRISTIN DIABILE's short shag. Lots of layers enhance texture and volume and play up the singer's cool platinum highlights.

To do: "Blow-dry, moving the brush away from your face. If you have a lot of natural wave, scrunch your hair before you blow it out. After you blow-dry, use a curling iron to add definition. To finish, add a little hair-spray for hold."

48 short HAIR



You want to look: MODERN & FLIRTY

Try: NAOMI WATTS' wavy mid-length. Her shiny, shoulder-brushing blonde waves cover several top trends. By center-parting the style, she gives it a classic touch.

To do: "Blow-dry for volume, then use a big-barrel curling iron and work it from mid-shaft through to the end. After you achieve the curl you desire, use a smoothing cream to break up the curls with your fingers."

You want to look: SEXY & STYLISH

Try: ANNE HATHAWAY's wavy bob. With just-above-the-shoulder-length, warm brown color and a sultry side part, this look is an eye-catcher every time—especially when styled for texture!

To do: "If you have natural waves, scrunch while drying. Next, lightly use a curling iron to achieve extra bend. A styling/texturizing cream will add texture and definition to different strands."

You want to look: FEMININE

Try: MAGGIE GYLLENHAAL's tightly curled bob. This is a 1930's retro look that's even more of a head-turner today! The whimsical twists also make hair appear shorter than it actually is.

To do: "Create pin curls by twisting individual strands, then roll them around your finger and push them towards your scalp; clip in place. Be generous with styling cream or hairspray. After blow- or air-drying, remove clips and run your fingers through, shaking and flipping hair. Finish with hairspray."

You want to look: ON-TREND

Try: EDIE FALCO's spiky pixie. The *Nurse Jackie* star opts for cutting-edge spikes, which happen to be very trendy right now!

To do: "Blow-dry using your fingers, which are the best tool for moving your locks in any direction you want them to go. Once hair is dry, use pomade, such as Cotton Uzu by Shu Uemura, to break up the pieces."

You want to look: GLAM

Try: MARION COTILLARD's curly bob. Her center-parted brunette tresses start off relatively straight, with loose curl taking off at the temples for a classically femme, night-out style.

To do: "Blow-dry, scrunching hair for extra texture. Using a medium-barrel iron, curl hair in toward your face. A styling cream and fingers will add separation; mist with finishing spray."
