THE LOOK Griffin pulled the hair into a high ponytail, back-combed the strands, pinned them in place to create a full bun, and finished the style with a satin headband.

WHY IT WORKS "When I think preppy, I always think simplicity," Griffin says. "The high bun with a hint of drama will wow. It's great for a beach wedding, as the hair is tucked under. If it's windy—God forbid—the last thing you want to think about is your hair falling out of place."
