SEW STYLISH

When it comes to updos, we're going from pins to needles. **Hair stitching** eliminates the use of bobby pins completely, simply using a needle and thread to craft the same coiffe: **SalonCapri** stylist **Graziella Lembo**, one of the few who offers the service in Boston, says the convenient style is also durable. "It holds all night. I have one client with a ton of hair—this is the only thing that has held for her, which is amazing," Lembo says. The process takes an average of 15 to 20 minutes and results in a romantic, soft-textured updo perfect for a benefit gala or a bridal party. To create the look, Lembo curls the entire head using a curling wand, then separates the hair into sections and loops the needle and thread through the curls. For an extra sparkle, she'll occasionally substitute gold or silver thread. At the end of the night, all you have to do is cut the thread and let the curls fall where they may. / *Coryn Doncaster*
